ALL children in Nursery, Pre-Prep, and Prep can return on Tuesday 5th January 2021 as normal. Drop off and collection times are *unchanged* and are detailed later in this document.

Students in Years 11 and 13 can return on Tuesday 5th January from 8.30am


Students in Years 7, 8, 9, 10, and 12 cannot return to St. James' before Monday 11th January 2021 *unless one of their parents is a critical worker*.

UPDATES FOR JANUARY 2021

As we broke for Christmas the government released details of a significant change to schools' approach to COVID-19 – *optional* mass testing.

It is not mandatory that schools implement mass testing in their setting, but as I believe regular testing will help protect us all, we shall seek to do so at St. James'.


ALL OTHER MITIGATIONS AND PROCESSES REMAIN UNCHANGED FROM THE MICHAELMAS TERM. TESTING DOES NOT REMOVE THE NEED FOR THESE.

ASYMPTOMATIC TESTING

From January, schools and parents will have the option of having their children tested for COVID, whether or not, they are showing any symptopms.

These tests can be/are then repeated weekly after an initial pair of tests.

Senior department pupils will self-administer these tests, but staff oversight and processing will be required.




PROCESS - Week commencing 4th January 2021

- Year 11 and Year 13 will be tested on the morning of Tuesday 5th January 2021*
- Years 7, 8, 9, 10, and 12 will be given specific time slots during the remainder of the week
- Staff can collect tests and self-administer at their convenience
- Pupils will be tested in a marquee placed on the Senior playground
- They will access it via the pedestrial gate of College Street
- They are then required to wait for their result in the Masters' Room, which will be setup as a socially distant waiting area. Approx 30 mins
- Pupils in Years 7, 8, 9, 10, and 12 will return home once their result is known

PROCESS — after initial pair of tests

- Pupils in Years 7, 8, and 9 will be tested during their PSHE lessons each week
- Sixth Form Pupils will be tested on Monday lunchtimes
- Years 10 and 11 will be tested on Friday lunchtimes
- Absent pupils will be swept up individually on their return to school

We require parental consent in be able to administer these tests – **they are optional, not compulsory.**

TESTING ACCURACY?

Negative Lateral Flow test results are not as accurate as PCR tests and recent studies suggest they *can* deliver false negative results.

It is vital that in conjunction with testing social distancing, hand sanitising, use of face coverings etc., are all maintained.

SOCIAL DISTANCING, BUBBLES & HYGIENE

SOCIAL DISTANCING

Within schools there is **no requirement** to enforce a *specific* social distance, either 1m or 2m.

We **must**, however, **minimise contact** between individuals and remove contact between certain bubbles.

Staff may interact with any/all bubbles without restriction.

HYGIENE

- Upon arrival to the school all pupils will sanitise their hands with Zoono.
- Additional hand sanitiser will be readily available.
- Pupils will wash hands regularly. For example: after break, before and after lunch, or when transitioning between activities.
- Between classes desks/tables/toys/resources will be disinfected and wiped down.

STAFF SHIELDING

On current evidence, PHE and DHSC advise that schools are **not** currently considered high risk settings when compared to other workplace environments. All staff, including those who are clinically extremely vulnerable, are required to attend St. James' School to teach.

BUBBLES

The purpose of **bubbles** is to support the *track and trace* system and quickly identify the people a confirmed carrier of COVID has been in contact with.

If bubbles are too small, our ability to operate to ensure that both **enrichment and academic** activities are possible is greatly restricted.

The School will divide into four main bubbles, by department: Nursery & Reception, Prep ½, Prep 3/4, Prep 5/6, Years 7/8/9 and Years 10-13.

The Prep and Senior bubbles will **subdivide** as follows:

Years 3/4 and Years 5/6
Years 7/8/9 and Years 10/11/12/13

Additional *mini bubbles* can be formed by:

- Boarders
- Pupils who use the school buses
- Extra-curricular clubs with fixed membership

And these bubbles **can** interact with the other bubbles. In this way, we can operate enrichment activities across year groups.

FIRE / EVACUATION

In the event of a fire, or the fire alarm sounding as a drill, the **usual procedures will be followed.**

KNOW THE COVID SYMPTOMS

- · A new continuous cough
- High temperature
- A loss of, or change in your usual sense of taste or smell

BUBBLES

St. James' is divided into the following six bubbles:

Nursery & Reception Prep 1 & Prep 2 Prep 3 & Prep 4 Prep 5 & Prep 6 Years 7-9 Years 10-13

SOCIAL DISTANCING

Whenever possible try to maintain at least a 1m distance from other people.

We are aiming to *minimise* contact between individuals

4 FACE COVERINGS

Face coverings should be worn when:

- · transitioning between lessons
- · when indoors during wet break/lunch
- using School Minibuses

Pupils may wear face coverings at any other time they wish to.

5 HYGIENE

You must sanitise your hands on arrival at school.

Wash your hands regularly, and re-sanitise between each lesson, after break, and both before and after lunch.

TRAVEL & QUARANTINE

All pupils and visitors arriving at St. James' will be screened regarding any recent travelling.

Where necessary, pupils will be required to self-isolate before being allowed to integrate with the other boarders and the school community. This can only be accommodated at St. James' at the beginning of an academic term.

The 'Safe List' of travel corridors changes regularly. Boarders should plan ahead for half-terms and holidays, considering that remaining in the UK may be safer. Host Families can be arranged with sufficient notice.

SUPPORT & WELLBEING

We are here to support you if you are anxious or unsure of anything COVID related. Speak to your Form Tutor, Head of Section or the School Nurse.

IF YOU FEEL UNWELL

Report to the School Nurse immediately

If you believe it to be COVID:

- use outdoor routes to the Medical Room if possible
- wear your mask
- keep 2m from other people, or if this is not possible, MAXIMISE separation















WHAT HAPPENS IF COVID COMES TO ST. JAMES'?

SHOWING SYMPTOMS? WHAT SHOULD I DO?

When a pupil or staff member develops symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19): a high temperature, new and persistent cough or a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia), however mild, they should self-isolate for at least 10 days from when the symptoms started.

If your child develops these symptoms at home, **please keep them at home** and inform the school as soon as you are able. Pupils and staff members exhibiting these symptoms will be sent home immediately.

BUT MY SYMPTOMS ARE NOT COVID...

Please err on the side of caution when assessing possible COVID symptoms. Whilst colds and flu are common at this time of year, COVID is seemingly more prevalent, and easily confused with these less dangerous infections. If in doubt, please keep your child at home.

We strongly recommend any children displaying possible COVID symptoms are tested.

WHAT IF SOMEONE TESTS POSITIVE?

Where the pupil or staff member tests positive, the **rest of their year group or bubble will be sent home and advised to self-isolate for 10 days**. The other household members of that bubble do not need to self-isolate unless the pupil or staff member they live with subsequently develops symptoms.

How Long To Self Isolate Advice

For any/all bubbles in self-isolation, our Home Learning programme will be immediately reinitiated.


How to find a Year Group / Pupil Timetable
